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Students set up herb garden within school

Penang, 1 August 2016 – The young students of SJK (T) Azad put their industrious green fingers to good use by creating a herb garden within their school compound here.

The children, aged 10 to 12, planted okra, chilli, tomato, brinjal, cucumber, moringa and 20 other types of commonly used herbal plants at the mini garden.

Measuring about 55sq m in size, the garden showcases the students' gardening skills and knowledge of composting which they had gained through the Eastern & Oriental Berhad Think Green community education programme.

Think Green partner, the Consumers' Association of Penang (CAP), had guided the children in the creation of the garden and the selection of suitable herbs for planting.

E&O group hospitality and lifestyle director Michael Saxon, who was present to launch the garden, said it was encouraging that schools like SJK (T) Azad have seen the value of the Think Green programme and that the school children have benefited from the programme.

"It is wonderful to see how these young children are extending the benefits and lessons from Think Green to their very own school compound with the setting up of this Mini Garden. In the long-term we hope to nurture among these children a sense of eco-consciousness and an awareness of their environment," he said.

SJK (T) Azad headmistress S. Kattamah expressed her gratitude to E&O for helping the students to fulfil their dream of having their very first garden in the school.

"The garden will be a great platform for the students to put what they have learnt from the Think Green programme into practice.

"Hopefully, they will then share the know-how with their families who will start growing their own healthy food at home," she said.

After starting the Think Green programme in 2014, E&O has continued to work closely with CAP and schools in the vicinity of Seri Tanjung Pinang, namely SK Tanjung Tokong, SJK(C) Hun Bin, SJK (T) Azad, Tadis Ar-Rasyidin and SMK Tanjung Bungah.

For the past one year, participating students learned about compost making, garden design and care, building raised beds, growing food, herb appreciation, natural farming, and making DIY planters.
